February 20-27 Basic Cruising/Bareboat Chartering sailing

vacation: Enjoy a beautiful cruise in the British Virgin Islands (BVI) while earning Basic Cruising (ASA 103) and Bareboat Chartering (ASA 104) certifications. ASA 104 serves as a required boating license (IPC) in most of Europe and Asia. Our live-aboard yacht, pictured above, is a spacious 41' Dufour with 3 cabins and 2 heads. We will set sail each morning and anchor off a different island each afternoon. You will have time for exploring BVI's famous Baths, snorkeling, swimming, and enjoying the beaches and bays of this world-famous group of islands. Our motorized dinghy will take us ashore for dinner at a different restaurant each night. We will learn navigation, boat systems, diesel engine checks, crew overboard techniques, emergency procedures, reefing, anchoring, sail trim, advanced knots, cooking underway, live-aboard skills. We will practice docking and mooring ball pick-ups.

ITINERARY: Board February 20 starting at 5pm at Hodges Creek Marina, Tortola, BVI. Sleep aboard yacht at dock. Set sail after orientation the next morning. We will visit 1-2 islands every day. Return to dock February 20 and disembark by 10 a.m.

Included: 7 breakfasts & 6 lunches onboard, bottled water, tropical drink nightly, onboard WiFi, snorkel, mask, fins, BVI cruising tax, National Parks tax, Textbooks; Coastal Cruising Made Easy, Bareboat Cruising Made Easy, ASA certifications, shared double berth, bed linens, towels. Packing list and textbooks will be sent upon registration. (ASA 101 is prerequisite for those taking the course.)

Not included: Flight to BVI (airport code: EIS) or St. Thomas (airport code: STT), taxi from airport (about \$30), BVI departure tax (\$50), dinners ashore, taxi & entry to The Baths (optional), personal beverages & snacks. BVI uses American dollar currency. Contact Capt. Joan for flight and hotel suggestions.

GETTING THERE: Fly into BVI; airport code-EIS and take 20 minute taxi to Dream Yacht Charters, Hodges Creek Marina, Tortola - or - Fly into St Thomas: airport code-STT and take 5-minute taxi to Charlotte Amalie ferry dock. Then a 45-minute ferry ride to Road Town, Tortola then a 40-minute taxi to Dream Yacht Charters. St. Thomas ferries stop running in early afternoon, so check ferry schedules. Please purchase ferry tickets in advance - see
